Introduction

Durham School for Girls is a family where the individual matters and we set ourselves the highest standards of behaviour, in dealing with each other and always in line with Qatari values and MARK values. We aim to promote trust and mutual respect for everyone. We believe that good relations, good manners and a secure learning environment play a crucial part in the development of intellectually curious pupils, who are motivated to become life-long learners. This profile is what forms THE DURHAM GIRL. We expect consistently good behaviour, and this is central to our commitment to the welfare and safety of all our pupils. Young people need clear and consistent boundaries where positive behaviour is praised and encouraged, whilst negative actions are dealt with appropriately. Durham School for Girls is an inclusive community. We treat everyone as an individual and aim to develop the whole person so that they are equipped to take their place in the modern world inline with the school mission.

Durham School for Girls Doha aims to provide a supportive environment that is tailored to meet the individual needs of girls as well as providing them with safety and learning environment to achieve the best results in line with Qatar's national vision to empower young women while preserving their national and Islamic identity and preparing them for opportunities and roles. <u>Aims</u>

It is the aim of this policy to support the 5 outcomes of *Every Child Matters*:

- **Being Healthy** we aim to promote children's mental health and wellbeing and keep them free from bullying or oppressive behaviour.
- Staying Safe we aim to create a safe and secure environment so that all learners can achieve their full potential.
- **Enjoying and achieving** we aim to minimise potential disruption to lessons and school life so that all can take full advantage of the opportunities offered both inside and outside the classroom.
- Making a Positive Contribution we encourage positive behaviour in the community which shows respect for others.
- **Achieving Economic Wellbeing** we aim to provide pupils with the preparatory life skills of self-discipline and taking responsibility for actions to enable independent living and economic well-being.

Expectations of a Durham Girl and MARK Values.

The Durham Family of staff and parents ensure pupils adhere to the expectations of a Durham Girl as our basic shared beliefs. We see education as a partnership and our staff are committed to excellence, aiming to achieve a spirit of trust and cooperation. We insist on the highest values and standards of behaviour inside and outside the classroom, as well as outside the College and in any written or electronic communication concerning the school.

Expectations of a Durham Girl

- We attend school ready to learn. Attendance is the key to success.
- We follow the Mark Values both in school and at home.
- We are responsible for our learning. Ready and prepared.
- Full school uniform is worn in line with the Uniform Policy.
- We respect our teachers and other students learning. Everyone has a right to learn and is equal.
- We know we can succeed and be the best that we can be. HPL Learners.
- We are responsible with technology and social media.
- We respect the school property and the property of others.
- We know and understand there is always someone to help and support us and we will help and support others.
- We are honest and kind and a sister to each other.
- We respect and follow the Qatari Culture and values.
- We are Ambassadors and Role Models for girls.
- We are proud of our school and the Durham Family.

The school insists that pupils treat all staff and each other with consideration and good manners, in line with our Expectations of a Durham Girls and MARK Values. We would expect our pupils to respond confidently to the demands of school life and to make every effort to contribute in a positive and productive manner. The expectations and MARK Values alongside the fulfilment of academic potential, are at the heart of our aims for our pupils, and expected behaviours run in parallel with the Qatari values that we seek to engender, nurture and reward. We believe that our pupils will ultimately be better equipped to succeed in their lives beyond school if we allow them opportunities to develop and apply these values.

Everyone has a right to feel secure and to be treated with respect, particularly the vulnerable. Harassment and bullying will not be tolerated, and all incidents will be dealt with promptly and effectively. The school has an effective Pastoral system where both behaviour and social and emotional needs are tracked alongside academic needs. Class teachers and Form Tutors play a vital role in monitoring and addressing behaviour in the school.

The School House System embeds and supports the Behavioral Policy and Links closely with the Rewards and Sanctions Policy for both Primary and Secondary. Houses provide 5 vertically streamed teams that run within the Durham Family. The houses are developed for Pastoral support for the girls with the "Big Sister Ethos" The School Council and Student Leaders are all peer role models for the girls and demonstrate and promote expected behaviour in the Durham Family.

We expect pupils to be ready to learn and participate in School activities. They should attend School and lessons punctually, adhere to the school routines. Pupils are expected to care for their environment and behave in a manner that reflects the best interests of the whole community.











Our School Values. (Durham UK and Durham Qatar)

Our MARK values underpin the whole structure of the philosophy of the school. MARK is followed by all members of the Durham Family and is taken from the UK Durham School structure. It is linked to our behaviour policy and rewards and expectations. All the MARK values are reticent to Qatari National Values and in line with Cultural and Religious beliefs.

Involvement of Parents and Guardians

Parents who accept a place for their child at Durham School for Girls undertake to uphold the school's policies and regulations. They will support the schools' values in matters such as upholding Qatari Values, attendance and punctuality, behaviour, uniform and appearance, standards of academic work, homework, private study and extracurricular activities. When behavioral issues arise, parents are expected to be part of the procedure.

The school will always contact parents or guardians on the second day of an unexplained absence to make sure that their child is safe. Please note that it is the policy of the school to allow holidays to be taken during term only in very unusual circumstances. Any request should be made, using the appropriate online form.

Durham School for Girls warmly welcomes Parents and Guardians to attend events and take an active role in their daughters' development.

Parents will be involved in meetings regarding their daughter's behaviour for any negative behaviour such as -

- Missing lessons
- Attitude and values ignored.
- Bullying
- Anti-social behaviour Impacting other girls learning.
- Anti-social behaviour not in line with MARK or Qatari values
- Misuse of technology
- Graffiti and vandalism of school and others property
- Any behaviour damaging the child, the family or the school's reputation.
